Review of Olmstead Plan Draft

Person-Centeredness

- Committee members liked the language around *choices* and *community* involvement.
- Discussed challenges in measuring person-centeredness with data.
 - Action Item: Laura will explore what data sources could be used to measure this.
- Clarification needed on the term "multifaceted platform."
- Concerns raised about potential Medicaid cuts and changes to ADA regulations.
 - o Action Item: Explore what data exists regarding ADA compliance.
- Suggested adding the word "inclusivity" throughout the plan.
 - o Are people with disabilities being considered in planning of activities?
- Questions about public understanding of a "person-centered plan."
 - Are individuals with person-centered plans being surveyed?
 - o Should Olmstead consider a survey through HHS?
 - This could be structured as part of a 360° review.
- Importance of bridging the gap between ensuring shared understanding of personcenteredness and successful implementation.

Health and Wellness

- Nutrition concerns noted: many individuals lack access to fresh, whole foods at home.
- Access to physical wellness opportunities discussed.
 - Examples include gym memberships and other fitness opportunities.

Next Steps / Action Items:

- 1. Laura to identify potential data sources for measuring person-centeredness.
- 2. Committee to clarify the meaning of "multifaceted platform" in the draft.
- 3. Gather data on ADA compliance to address concerns about policy changes.
- 4. Consider integration of the word "inclusivity" into the plan language.
- 5. Explore feasibility of an HHS-supported survey on understanding of personcentered plans.
